## ACHGS Meeting Minutes May 9, 2020

We had 4 in attendance in person and 7 via Zoom meeting.

Meeting was called to order at 11:03 am by President Dawn Taylor.

Invocation by Greg Barron.

Motion to accept minutes as written by Greg Barron and second by Gay Blalock. Minutes approved.

President's Report: We are upset open house and heritage days was cancelled because that kept us from getting much needed funds. However, we are glad that Sam King and Freddie Cook are back healthy and back working on the LRSH.

Treasurer: See handout. Need to put balance on hand in the minutes. Balance on hand as of May 9, 2020 was \$15,924.12. Motion to accept report by Greg Barron. Second Marcia McLaurin. Report approved as written.

# Rice Production in Amite County By Greg Barron

When discussing the subject of rice production, little thought is given to Amite County. However in 1840, the growing of rice was the norm because of the want of self sufficiency with 167,497 pounds (83.7485 tons) of rice produced. Rice was produced in the County until at least the 1930's. Pa Robert Barron experimented with rice cultivation for a number of years during the 20's and 30's. Cousin Howard Lee Barron and I discussed this several weeks back as both of us remembered being shown the area on The Hill (Barron property) where the rice field was placed.

A farmer had to know basic water hydraulics in two ways, the actual irrigation as well as that in the root of the rice plant. The field planted was in a low spot with a slip dug pond providing the water. The movement of this water was instrumental in the growing of the plant, therefore flooding of the field was necessary. No modern pumps were used as this was all done by hand. The harvest was also all done by hand. The knowledge of planting was obtained by trial and error.

Certain fields were used differently on a rotation basis with crimson clover being a soil preservative or cover crop. Corn was also a major part of the crop each year for man and beast. Cotton was a staple cash crop as were the fields of sugar cane which was made into syrup then sold and bartered for commercial products.

Rice was produced for consumption on The Hill. Pa Robert did not have a formal education. His education consisted of learning through the process of doing. From ginning, the milling of lumber, syrup making, raising dairy and beef cattle, surveying and well digging, and raising hogs and goats. As far as I know there were never any sheep raised. A time of self sufficiency which is certainly lacking today. My book learning, completely different than the vast knowledge of agriculture which Pa Robert, born the year of 1885, had... I can only wish for his knowledge. Much of his knowledge was passed to my father. Unfortunately, we lose some of that "learning" with each generation as it will never return...
