President Dawn Taylor called the meeting to order at 10:19 am in the meeting room of the Liberty library. There were 9 members attending. Greg Barron gave the invocation.

President Report:

The society had a good day on Heritage Day.

The Bethany book compiled by Frances Phares has been reprinted.

Vice President Report: VP Barron reported the following field trip and event plans:

- Arrangements have been made for interested members to visit the Hughes house following the meeting.
- In the fall, the society will visit a slave cemetery on Greensburg Road; the slaves buried there are not documented and attempt will be made to see if any can be identified.
- On February 11, 2017, a field trip to visit the grave site of Colonel Thomas Hinds, Commander of Hinds Dragoons in the War of 1812 under which a number of Amite Countians served. The grave is in Jefferson County.
- On March 11, 2017, the society will take a bus trip (all day affair) to visit the Chalmette Battlefield area (War of 1812) where Hinds Dragoons fought the British. After lunch visits to Jackson Square and the St. Louis Cathedral are planned.

In December 2017, the society Open House will be held at the Amite County Courthouse. Plans are being made to have a ceremony officially dedicating a historical monument to the Amite

The meeting adjourned to the program at 11:35 am.



BITS AND PIECES OF AMITE COUNTY HISTORY

While browsing some old copies of the Southern Herald newspaper on the "Chronicling America" web site sponsored by the Library of Congress I ran across an issue that raised a matter of history that I'd never heard about. Apparently in the late 1800s, although the county was divided into districts much as it is today, the Board of Supervisors did not assume responsibility for maintaining all the public roads in the county. I have not been able to determine which roads the supervisors did maintain, the following article appears to show that certain roads were kept up by the local residents according to a published list of responsible parties and the portions of the roads assigned to each. While this will obviously not be of interest to everyone with respect to road information it presents, it does provide a long list of residents living in the county on the publication date of April 2, 1887. Some of you might find it interesting to review the names for those of your ancestors. Other items are from the same issue.
