December Meeting, Social Event & Membership Drive -

The ACHGS December meeting was an open house social event and membership drive at the Little Red Schoolhouse in Liberty on Saturday, December 3, 2005, from 1:00 to 5:00 PM. The Little Red Schoolhouse "Music Room" was used for greeting attendees and registering visitors and new members. A wide assortment of excellent refreshments were available in the Conference / Meeting Room at the Library. A "living history" of Confederate re-enactors and equipment was displayed. Musical performance of patriotic and folk songs was attempted but the high winds that day put an early end to that. This proved to be a popular event with well over a hundred people attending. About 25 new members signed up at that time.

ACHGS Forum now online -

A forum, sometimes called a discussion board or message board, has been operative now for about three months. This was created to encourage exchange of information on Amite County history, genealogy, and culture. Unfortunately, we've had only twelve registrants join the forum thus far. We know there are far more members than this with internet access considering the number of email addresses we have on file.

I would like to again encourage all internet-active ACHGS members to register for membership on the forum and contribute to it. Membership in the ACHGS is not required to join so pass the word to non-members that you might know with an interest in Amite County.

- a password of your own choosing to sign on • to the forum
- a valid e-mail address to which the activation e-mail can be sent.

ACHGS web mail still available -

If you are a member of ACHGS with internet capability but did not have it or did not provide an email address at the time you joined the society, you may use the ACHGS web mail feature to be given a web mail address associated with the

Signing up for the web site mail feature is a little more complicated than just registering for the forum but it effectively gives you a separate (and free) e-mail service should you choose to use it.

The ACHGS is now a tax-exempt organization status fully approved by the IRS as we reported in the last newsletter. As a result, any member dues paid as well as any contributions to the society in 2005 are tax-deductible as a charitable contribution.

Reminder on major web site enhancements -

As reported originally in volume 1 number 2, web site pages have been created for publication of history articles and genealogy. In addition, the criteria by which submissions will be judged for acceptability have been posted to the site.

All members are encouraged to submit information of reasonable length for posting. To date only one member has submitted anything.

The submissions criteria are designed to assure that contributors have legal rights to the information they contribute so that copyright infringement lawsuits against the ACHGS organizationally and/or the site manager personally can be prevented.

With the forum now available for registrants to post their own materials to boards therein, the forum rules have considered the web site publication criteria. Lengthy posts to the forum may be moved to the appropriate web site page to more efficiently use the forum space that is available. Any materials moved by the site manager will be reproduced exactly as entered to the forum (but without the breaks between topics) and will be replaced by a hyperlink to take a reader to the web site page containing the relocated material.
