## AMITE COUNTY HISTORICAL AND GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

Minutes of 8 September 2007 meeting DRAFT

President Oma Gordon called the meeting to order at 10:02 AM in the meeting room of the Pike – Amite – Walthall Library in McComb, MS. There were 22 attendees. President Oma Gordon asked Linda Lea to open the meeting with prayer.

President Gordon then asked if all present were getting the newsletter which contains the minutes of the previous meeting. No one indicated that they weren't. She then pointed out he request in the newsletter for feedback from members. She then stated how pleased the society was to be at the library for the meeting and thanked Mr. Morley for the library's hospitality. She then asked if everyone had reviewed the draft minutes of the March meeting. No one indicated that they had not. Glen Huff moved to approve the minutes as written. Linda Lea seconded. The motion passed without dissention.

<u>President Report</u>: Pres. Gordon read two letters recently received by the society.

- The first was from Mrs. Patsy Bostick of Stillwater, OK, and was enclosed with a "duster" or "motor coat" donated for the Little Red Schoolhouse (LRSH). The garment dates to the 1905-1910 era and was worn by women traveling in open carriages or cars to protect their clothes from being dirtied. The duster was originally owned and possibly made by Margaret Gordon, wife of Thomas Jefferson Gordon, (of Amite County) and is ornamented with quite a lot of embroidery.
- The second was from LTC Lee Terrell thanking

the society for the life member certificate.

Pres. Gordon then announced that Mrs. Frances Phares has donated a hand-made quilt made by Mrs. Leona Hazlewood Jones. The quilt won first prize in the 1933 county fair. Later, she reported that the editor of the New Roads, LA, newspaper had interviewed her by telephone about Dr. Tichenor's time in Amite County. She later sent him some printed material. An article on Dr. Tichenor is planned for the newspaper.

<u>VP Report</u>: VP Barron reported the following:

- On August 25, VP Barron and member Dawn Taylor met with a Canadian film crew, toured them around Liberty and discussed a film project that will feature in-depth film coverage of 12 out of the over 200 American towns with the name Liberty. The visitors included Johnny Zyrenski from Vancouver and a lady (first name Janet) from Montreal. They plan to return for a 5-day period later in the fall to actually do filming.
- The society will have a display at the I-55 Welcome Center near Osyka on September 29.
   Volunteers to help with supporting the display for a couple of hours during the day.
- The annual Open House / Membership Drive will definitely be held on December 1, 2007.
   If it can be arranged, the Winston Wilkinson house will be the featured location for the event.

<u>Secretary Report</u>: Secy. Wayne Anderson had no report.

<u>Treasurer Report</u>: Treasurer Gay Blalock had no report.

#### **Committee Reports:**

 Little Red Schoolhouse – Pres. Gordon has asked Mayor Stratton to seal the windows with caulking and he agreed to have that done as soon as the maintenance personnel are available. This will help prevent infiltration of moist air that is contributing to the mold growth. Also, the Board of Supervisors has approved purchase and installation of a dual function heating/cooling type air conditioner for the second floor room.

- WPA Books Pres. Gordon reported that we still have a few sets and, based on demand as we approach the Bicentennial, more copies will likely be ordered.
- Bicentennial Committee News Mrs. Oma reported that there has been no news since last month.

Old business: Pres. Gordon again reported that the school records are being donated to the society and the tax records are being loaned until there is adequate room at the courthouse for their storage.

New business: Mrs. Frances Phares announced that she had extra photocopies of an article on the Liberty Confederate Monument from the March/April, 1987, issue of Mississippi Magazine if anyone would like a copy. Glen Huff mentioned the Amite Co. Land Grants map book (which the society has a copy of) and indicated that it is a good source of information on land-owners in the nineteenth century.

After a call for any additional business, Pres. Gordon asked for a motion to adjourn. Mrs. Pearl Strange moved; Treasurer Gay Blalock seconded. VP Barron declared the business meeting adjourned at 10:45 am and reminded the group that Mr. Gabriel Morley would begin his presentation at 11:00 am.

After about a 15-minute break, Mr. Morley made his presentation explaining a bit about his history of coming to the library, the various improvements in services that the library has undergone in order to provide for a separate genealogy research room. He described the various genealogy materials available at the library. Near the end of the formal presentation, the group moved to the re-

search room so that Mr. Morley could actually demonstrate some of the materials in use. In addition to a variety of printed material in book form, the library currently has records on microfiche and microfilm and has a single computer terminal from which online genealogy records can be accessed. Right now only one database is accessible but the bigger Ancestry.com service is scheduled to be added by year's end.

Following Mr. Morley's presentation of about an hour's length, the group dispersed and most went to Golden Corral for lunch.
