Draft Minutes of 3 March 2007 meeting

President Oma Gordon called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM in the meeting room of the library in Liberty, MS. There were 45 attendees. Margie Causey was asked to open the meeting with

President Gordon then asked if all present had reviewed the draft minutes of the February meeting. After a few moments to allow those who had not read through the draft to do so, Greg Barron moved to approve the minutes as written. James Allen Causey seconded. The motion passed without dissention.

President Report: Pres. Gordon reported the following:

- The society has been found to be very popular among local residents. More and more individuals are making donations of artifacts and records to assist the society in its endeavors and to help assure the items preservation.
- Liberty Mayor, **Southern Herald** publisher, and society member Ricky Stratton has donated a large quantity of old newspaper issues predating 1950.
- As reported earlier, Mr. Donnie Vines wishes to donate artifacts that are currently located in the deserted Virgie Hays house; however, he has requested that the society delay its planned "work day" to go through the materials and evaluate what should be kept and what should be trashed. More will be announced on this later

- Mrs. Joy Willson from Osyka was introduced. As reported previously, she had provided information on the location the burial plots of Rev. Shirk and his relations.
- Mr. Wicks is coming to visit the Little Red Schoolhouse.

<u>VP Report</u>: VP Barron reported the following:

- Mr. Rimes, who has recently been ill, was welcomed back.
- The larger than usual attendance was noted and attendees thanked for coming.
- Some comments and anecdotes about Mrs. Virgie Hays and her career teaching at Liberty were given.
- The society should express its gratitude and appreciation to Ernest Herndon at the Enterprise Journal for his efforts in helping get out the news of meetings such as this quarterly day-time meeting and news of the presentations. The increased attendance is probably due in part to Mr. Herndon's reporting.

<u>Secretary Report</u>: Secy. Wayne Anderson had no report but did relate another brief anecdote about Mrs. Virgie Hays.

<u>Treasurer Report</u>: Treasurer Gay Blalock provided a Treasurer's report showing that the society has a balance of \$6474.82 as of the day of the meeting.

Committee Reports:

- WPA Book Reprint Pres. Oma Gordon reported that about 30 sets of the books remain for sale.
- Little Red Schoolhouse Mrs. Vera Prestridge had no report.
- Little Red Schoolhouse Mrs. Lessie McCarstle was not present for the meeting.

- Bicentennial Committee Pres Gordon recognized Mrs. Hattie Nunnery, the Amite County Bicentennial Committee Chairman and asked her to present a brief report on the status of planning and activities for the Bicentennial. She reported the following:
 - 1. The committee was created about a year ago.
 - 2. Will report to the Board of Supervisors at the next meeting on the committee's recommended plans for celebrating the event.
 - 3. The Bicentennial will be observed in the period April 27 May 2, 2009.
 - Melanie Hubbs is handling publicity, currently a web site and promotion of the event on media (radio, TV, newspaper, etc., is planned
 - 5. An exact list of activities has not been finalized but will likely include most or all of the following:
 - a) parade with floats
 - b) pageant (but not likely one as large as the Sesqui-Centennial one)
 - bands and musical groups some in concert, some in parade
 - d) hoedowns, dances, fireworks
 - e) period clothing fashion show
 - f) tours of certain homes
 - g) walking/driving tour of Liberty using a recorded guide
 - h) presentations by Amite County authors and storytellers
 - i) local Native American history (Houma, Natchez, Choctaw tribes included, being put together by Ronnie Travis
 - j) reenactments
 - k) displays of antique cars and/ or other items
 - historical displays, especially collections (will likely use va-

- cant buildings in town for display of privately-owned collections)
- m) display or history of the railroads, including the Liberty White and those in the west side of the county
- n) will have food vendors and arts and crafts displays in any outdoor activities which may draw crowds
- o) will emphasize teaching of local history in the schools during this lead up period and in 2009

Old business: None. New business: None

Before the meeting closed, Pres. Gordon reminded visitors and members who rarely attend meetings to be sure and sign the attendance sheet.

Following a closing prayer by Gay Blalock, the business meeting adjourned at about 10:45 AM.

After a brief break, VP Greg Barron introduced Dr. Myron C. Noonkester* from William Carey University who presented a program on early Amite County history entitled "Why the British Left Mississippi." The verbal program was complemented with a bound booklet to which attendees could refer as various historical people, places and events were explained. The program was well presented to an attentive audience. Several remarks were made following it that if teachers had made history so interesting and entertaining in school, the students may have been more attentive in the classroom. Since the numbers of booklets were not sufficient to provide a copy for each individual, anyone wanting a copy can contact Myron Noonkester to arrange getting one. VP Barron or Dan Morgan can provide contact information if needed.

*Dr. Noonkester is Dean of Arts, Humanities and Sciences, Professor of History and Co-Director of the Carey Center at William Carey University in Hattiesburg.

Upon conclusion of the presentation, Wayne Anderson gave a blessing and the group had lunch. Following lunch those that wished to remain visited the Little Red Schoolhouse.
