### AMITE COUNTY HISTORICAL AND GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY Minutes of July 12, 2008, meeting Draft

President Oma Gordon called the meeting to order at 10:02 AM in the meeting room of the library in Liberty, MS. There were 18 attendees. President Oma Gordon asked Greg Barron to open the meeting with prayer.

President Gordon asked if all had read the minutes. Hearing no questions, she asked for a motion to approve the minutes. Greg Barron made a motion; James Allen Causey seconded to approve minutes as amended. The motion passed without dissention.

- <u>President Report</u>: President Gordon reported on the acquisition of artifacts from the Virgie Hays home and thanked Vickie Netterville, Cathy Jaecke and her husband, Dan Morgan and Scotty and Dot Whittington for volunteering to move the materials from the Hays home to the Little Red Schoolhouse. She then asked for anyone who will have some time on July 14 to please come help inventory and catalog the collected materials.
- <u>VP Report</u>: VP Barron reported the following:

- 2. He reported that the donation jar for raising money to pay for the piper to attend the Bicentennial events next year had received a sizeable accumulation of money from those attending the June meeting and that we were well on our way to securing the piper.
