BITS AND PIECES OF AMITE COUNTY HISTORY EBENEZER CHURCH MEMORIES

SCHOOLMASTERS

This following data relating to Amite County schoolmasters was compiled from the 1850 Amite County Census Record. There were eighteen men listed as schoolmasters. The youngest was 17 years and the oldest 56 years. Five were born in New York; two in South Carolina; one each in Kentucky, Georgia, and North Carolina; and eight in Amite County or Mississippi. David Pemble's real estate was valued at \$1,000 and Riley Cockerham's was valued at \$230 - the only owners of real estate. Please share genealogical data and/or stories on these families.

1. Allen Thompson Avery, the son of Simeon Avery and Sarah Thompson, was born on 13 Jan 1833 in Liberty, MS area and died on 22 Sep 1897 in Liberty, MS. The home place was located west of Liberty beyond Tanyard Creek.. His and Amanda's place of burial is unknown.

US Census 1850 notes Allen Avery is a school master living with his parents and siblings. US Census Amite Co, MS 1870 - No 1938 - Allen T Avery, 37 yrs, Farmer, real estate valued \$6,000, personal estate valued \$3,500; A C A, 32 yrs, F; A Z, 2 yrs, F; A L, 8/12 yrs; A M Hazlewood (sister-in-law) 25 yrs, F, Teacher

Allen Thompson Avery and **Amanda Catherine Hazlewood** were married on 2 Mar 1865 in Amite Co, MS. **Amanda Catherine Hazlewood**, daughter of David Henry Hazlewood and Catharine "Katie" or "Kate" Thompson, was born on 3 Aug 1838 in Amite Co, MS and died on 26 Sep 1901 in Liberty, Amite Co, MS. She was baptized on 29 Sep 1858 at New Providence Baptist Church, which was organized abt 1805. Allen Thompson Avery and Amanda Catherine Hazlewood had the following children:

1.1. Allie Z Avery was born on 17 Feb 1868 in Liberty, Amite Co, MS. She died on 25 Dec 1947 at Zion Hill, Amite Co, MS and was buried in Liberty Cemetery, Liberty, MS. Allie Z Avery and Charles Tillman Dixon II were married on 16 Jan 1886 in Liberty, MS. Southern Herald Newspaper clipping - "Married: On Wednesday evening last at the residence of the bride's parents, by

Charles Tillman Dixon II, son of Charles Tillman Dixon MD and Nancy McDowell, was born on 19 Dec 1856 in Amite Co, MS. He died on 28 Apr 1934 at his residence in Amite County and was buried in Liberty Cemetery, Liberty, MS.

- 1.2. **Anna Lillian "Lillie" Avery** was born on 1 Jan 1870 in Liberty, MS. She died on 16 Dec 1917 in Liberty and was buried in Liberty Cemetery. **Anna Lillian "Lillie" Avery** and **Seaborn Reynolds "Seab" Jones**were married on 11 Mar 1903 in Liberty, and resided in Liberty. **Seaborn Reynolds "Seab" Jones**, son of Moses Henry "Mose" Jones and Eliza Letitia White, was born on 16 Feb 1872 in Olio, MS. He died on 12 May 1952 in Centreville, MS and was buried in Liberty Cemetery, Liberty, MS. "Seab" was a farmer.
- 1.3. **Allen David Avery** was born on 12 Feb 1872 in Liberty and died on 12 Aug 1884 in Liberty.
- 1.4. **Arthur Horatio Avery** was born on 25 Sep 1876 in Liberty, MS and died young in Liberty.

- 1. **John Terrell** was born about 1795 in GA. John was a Schoolmaster. John Terrell and Sarah Young were married on 21 Mar 1822 in Amite Co,MS. Bk 2B, p 84 Incomplete **Sarah Young**was born about 1807 in Darlington, South Carolina. John Terrell and Sarah Young had the following children:
 - 1.1. **Griffin F Terrell** was born on 29 Mar 1830 in Amite Co, MS. He died on 3 Feb 1890 and was buried in Terrell-Ferrell Cemetery, Amite Co, MS. Griffin Terrell's, Real Estate value was \$1,200 in 1870. Per 1870 Census Amite County, FN 348. **Griffin F Terrell** and **Mary Jane Jones**were married on 29 May 1860 in Amite Co, MS. **Mary Jane Jones** was born on 2 Feb 1842. She died on 3 Feb 1890 andwas buried in Terrell Cemetery, Amite Co, MS. Griffin F Terrell and Mary Jane Jones had the following children:

 - 1.1.2. Nancy "Nannie" Matilda Terrellwas born on 22 Sep 1864. She died on 25 Feb 1923 and was buried in Terrell Cemetery, Amite Co , MS.  - 1.1.4. **Jacob Terrell** was born on 18 Aug 1867. He died on 18 Aug 1867 and was buried in Terrell Cemetery, Amite Co , MS.

 - 1.1.6. Lulah Terrell was born about 1874.
 - 1.1.7. Arie Terrell was born about 1878.
 - 1.2. **James A Terrell**was born on 10 Mar 1832 in Amite Co, MS. He died on 26 Nov 1890 and was buried in Terrell Cemetery, Amite Co, MS. **James A Terrell**and **Caroline M** were married. **Caroline M** was born on 3 Sep 1840. She died on 3 Apr 1873 and was buried in Terrell Cemetery, Amite Co, MS.
 - 1.3. **William A Terrell**was born about 1836 in Amite Co, MS. William was a student in 1850. Co E 45 Miss InfCSA.
 - 1.4. E J Terrell was born about 1839 in Amite Co, MS. E J was a student in 1850.
 - 1.5. Mary S Terrell was born about 1842 in Amite Co, MS.
 - 1.6. Sarah D Terrell was born about 1845 or 1848 in Amite County, MS. Sarah D Terrell and
